# New Jersey 4-H Code of Conduct

The primary purpose of the New Jersey 4-H Code of Conduct is to ensure the safety and well-being of all participants at 4-H sponsored events and activities. It applies to all participants, with participants defined as 4-H members, their parents, and volunteers.

As a participant in the 4-H program, I will:

- Conduct myself in a courteous manner and treat members, parents, 4-H volunteers, Extension staff, judges and others with respect. Appropriate language and behavior are expected at all times.
- Respect and adhere to the rules and guidelines of the 4-H program including all those specific to a 4-H event or activity.
- Uphold an individual's right to dignity by supporting an environment of inclusion which welcomes involvement
  of participants from all backgrounds.
- Accept supervision and support from county and state 4-H staff while participating in the 4-H program. This
  includes acceptance of supervision and support from appointed 4-H volunteers coordinating 4-H events and
  activities.
- Obey local, state and federal laws.

Participants who fail to adhere to the New Jersey 4-H Code of Conduct are subject to a range of disciplinary actions. Such actions will be taken in compliance with the New Jersey 4-H Discipline Policy and Procedure. When appropriate, immediate corrective action will be taken at the 4-H event to ensure the safety and welfare of all participants.

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



# **HEAT STRESS IN HORSES**

Heat stress can put a horse in serious danger. Here are some casues, signs, treatments and prevention methods that owners and riders should understand.

Did you know?

65% Portion of a horse's cooling process that can be attributed to sweating



- Dehydration
- · Hot, humid weather
- · Poor conditioning
- Inability to sweat normally
- · Heat generated in muscles
- · Transporting in hot conditions
- Insufficient oxygen intake
- · Riding too fast for horse's fitness level
- Exhaustion
- · Insufficient time to aclimate to warm weather
- Intense exercise

# What to Look for

- Inability to Sweat
- · Poor recovery after workout
- High or irregular heart rate
- Falling/stumbling
- · Reduced tolerance to exercise
- Seizures
- · Reduction in skin elasticity
- Refusal to move
- · Colic
- Reduced interest in food/water

### Take Action

- 1 Stop exercise immediately
- 2 Relocate to shade area with light breeze or fan
- 3 Offer water
- 4 Cool rapidly with hose or sponge focusing on legs, head, back, neck, areas where large veins are close to skin
- 5 Scrape away excess water as it heats up
- 6 Refrain from draping horse with a cooling towel, which can trap
- 7 Massage major muscle groups if horse refuses to move

- 8 Monitor rectal temperature until it recedes to 101º
- 9 After recovery, hand walk for about 15 minutes to prevent cramping
- 10 Monitor for several hours
- 11 Administer electrolytes
- 12 Administer intravenous fluids if horse is in shock or dehydration is severe
- 13 Contact veterinarian if temperature exceeds 104º and won't go down
- 14 Refrain from administering medications while dehydrated

# Visible Signs of Heat Stress

- Rectal temperature over 103.5°F
- · Sluggishness, weakness or poor posture
- · Hot, dry skin (but might sweat under mane)
- Sunken eye sockets
- · Cramping, spasms, loss of muscular control
- Rapid breathing/flared nostrils

### **Future Prevention**

- Improve fitness level
- Emphasize hydration
- Keep coat hair shorter
- Monitor heart rate recovery
- Incorporate rest periods during exercise
- Offer water immediately after exercise
- · Don't ride too fast/climb too steep a hill for fitness level
- Use appropriate cool-down techniques
- Reduce/delay work if over 90°

# Check Out these Ideas to Keep your Dogs Cool at Fair:

- Grab a bowl, fill it three-quarters of the way full with water and place it in the freezer overnight. Place it beside his regular water bowl before you leave for work. As the ice melts, your dog will have a second bowl of cool water during the day.
- Pour chicken or beef broth into ice cube trays. When frozen, place a
  few of these yummy pooch ice pops in the food bowl with your dog's
  kibble, or simply add to the water bowl for a flavored beverage.
- Mash two ripe bananas and mix with four tablespoons of low-fat Greek yogurt and a few sprigs of chopped parsley or peppermint to aid digestion and promote fresh breath. Freeze and scoop out when your pooch is particularly good.
